

## The Fourth JUAA Presidents' Seminar

### [Objectives]

Universities in Japan face many demands from society, such as the promotion of globalization and the development of governance systems. Meanwhile, the national government reports and policy papers have offered various recommendations on higher education reform to address those challenges. While these demands and recommendations can be seen as positive expectations, to what extent should universities meet these expectations?

Universities are, in principle, independent, autonomous entities. University reform should therefore be carried out in accordance with goals and plans formulated based on the founding philosophy and mission of each university. Yet recent years have seen universities introduce new policies and programs without sufficient consideration on this point.

In view of the recent development, the upcoming presidents' seminar will focus on the theme "University Reforms that Build on Institutional Strengths" Featuring lectures by current university presidents from Japan and abroad on the reform initiatives that value and enhance the institutional strengths of individual universities with a particular emphasis on the role of the president's leadership, the seminar will provide an opportunity for the participants to contemplate the future of universities.

Our international lecturer is a university president from Thailand, a country expected to serve as the "Quality Hub" higher education in the ASEAN region. The lecture on the current state of higher education in Thailand will provide perspectives and insights to help us explore the reform initiatives needed to create internationally attractive universities. From Japan, we have invited the president of a university that has actively implemented reform by capitalizing on its strengths. They will speak about effective university reform and the role of the president's leadership in it.
