**Notable Strength**

*Student support*

- It is commendable that the Graduate School of Management, GLOBIS University supports its students continuously from enrollment to the post-graduation period to provide opportunities to create networks and cultivate student aspirations. For example, the program offers lectures by politicians and scholars at the annual over-night Aska Conference and the Top Seminars, held quarterly, that include executives and persons of culture as guest participants. Moreover, graduates of the university gather at quarterly meetings, where they learn from each other's experiences and form networks.

**Suggestions for Improvement**

*Educational content, methods, and outcome*

- Although the course requirements and procedures for granting degrees have been clearly stated in the regulations, the policies for awarding degrees that clarify expected learning outcomes at the time of program completion have not been stated. The basic principle for organizing the curriculum is also absent. The degree policies and the curriculum principles should be established in accordance with the purpose and educational goals of the university and made public.

*Internal quality assurance*

- Although it is required by law that institutions publicize the degrees held by the faculty, the university's website does not contain this information. This should be corrected.
